

Night Light Crisis Cafes

Providing a place of peace to those experiencing Mental Health Crisis

The Greater Lincoln Active Faith Network has enabled a new partnership between the NHS and the local Churches within Lincoln to provide Crisis Cafes for those experiencing a mental health crisis.

The vision of the Night Light Cafes will be to provide a non-clinical out of hour's safe space, run predominantly by trained volunteers. In these places of safety, guests will receive a warm welcome and acceptance in a peaceful environment. They will be offered activities and support to help de-escalate their crisis.

Acts Trust, who oversee Restore, Energize, Foodbank and many other city-wide projects, are the lead Christian Organisation who will be facilitating this project. A coordinator is now employed to oversee the project and will be ensuring that Churches have all the necessary training needed to run a Night Light Café. This initiative is being funded solely by the NHS who are also offering ongoing support.

The aim is for the cafes to be hosted in seven different locations, seven nights a week across the City of Lincoln. Opening times will be 10pm-2am, and referrals can be made directly by professionals, or via the Crisis Line.

Suicide rates in Lincolnshire are above national average, and the statistics show a real need for help to be given when people are experiencing a mental health crisis.

This new project will have a great impact on our City, and is the result of Churches working together to identify ways in which they can combine their resources and expertise.

The first Night Light Café will be launched early March 2020. The next phase of volunteer training will also commence in March and we would love to hear from you if you are interested in volunteering at one of our cafes.

working hard to consider how we might live more simply that others might simply live and the world be repaired. For example we are trying to reduce the amount of plastics in our homes and church especially single-use plastic. Just one small way this can be done is by using bar soap again. Even shampoo bars and conditioners are available. As Christians many of us are endeavouring to consider our life styles. Perhaps, if you don't have an item about these things in your newsletter, you could consider making space to challenge each other and suggest other ways to help so that we may honour that "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth...and God saw that it was good...and God said: "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." Here is something to make us all think: 1 reusable bag = 783 plastic bags; 1 reusable bottle = 83 plastic bottles; 1 reusable cup = 1256 plastic cups; 1 reusable straw = 295 plastic straw. We can all make a difference. Jane Goodall's quote is: "Every individual matters. Every individual has a role to play. Every individual makes a difference." Who is Jane Goodall? Look her up and see what a difference she is making through education.



WASHINGBOROUGH NEWS



27th January 2020 marked 75 years since Russian soldiers liberated the largest of the Nazi extermination camps at Auschwitz-Birkenau.



To commemorate the day hell was revealed, members at Washingborough Methodist and friends from St Johns, Canwick & Heighington Parish travelled to Beth Shalom, the National Holocaust Centre near Laxton, to reflect on how one of the most civilized nations of its day could butcher fellow humans deemed to be undesirable.

It was moving to hear the story of one child survivor, to follow the journey of Leo as the world descended into madness and chilling to recall how in 12 short years such horrors were allowed to happen.

Many of us were struck by the pile of stones at the entrance to mark all the children slaughtered and the fact that it has taken 25 years of visitors each laying a stone to represent but a 1/3 of the lives lost.

A sobering place but well worth a visit.

On Sunday January 26th Washingborough Methodist hosted a service to mark Holocaust Memorial Day and reflect on stories of those deemed 'righteous among the nations,' non -Jews who bravely refused to be bystanders and became upstanders, saving Jewish lives, sometimes at the cost of their own.

While the haunting theme from Schindler's List was played we laid images of these righteous folk beneath an image of a flame to give thanks for their courage.

We were reminded and challenged by the words of Sir Nicholas Winton who rescued 669 children from Nazi-occupied Europe:

"Don't be content in your life just to do no wrong, be prepared every day to try and do some good"
