Dear Friends

I remember when our children were younger, they used to love a book called, 'Five minutes peace.' This was a story about a mum and her children and the need for her to have just 5 minutes peace. I think we all have times when we need to experience peace. Isaiah 9 speaks of the coming Messiah as being 'the Prince of Peace.'

In his book 'Living differently to make a difference,' Will Donaldson (BRF ISBN 978-0-85746-671-6) explores the beatitudes. The Sermon on the mount contains what Donaldson calls 'a kind of manifesto of Kindness.' Within it is found 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. (Matthew 5:9). The Christian ideal is for all to live in peace.

He speaks of the peace of God being much bigger concept in the bible than 'feeling peaceful' or having 'piece of mind.' The Hebrew word used is:

What is *Our Calling* at Reepham?

A reflection by church steward, Richard Wills.

The Circuit's question “*What is to be done?*”, prompted us to look at what we were doing; and what we might do in future. We are not unrealistic about the prospects for an aging church congregation. However, when we looked at ourselves, we realised that we were already doing much good work. Furthermore, the Circuit's question, encouraged us to ask what *Our Calling* might be?

In our congregation of around 25, we are fortunate to have many active, able and willing people: local preachers, supernumerary ministers, musicians and those active in Methodist Church governance. We generate activities that enrich our worship and discipleship – Methodist Women in Britain, a fellowship group (Discoverers) and a variety of Sunday services. Yet, we also reach out to our communities, directly and indirectly. We organise a fortnightly Fun Friday, which provides activities and a light lunch for older members of our community. We run occasional Holidays at Home, notably on August Tuesdays, with longer sessions of activities, entertainment and food, that attracts an even wider group of senior citizens. We have a Craft Club, a poetry group and a monthly Coffee and Chat on Saturday mornings. We raise money for other charities and make regular contributions to the Lincoln Community Larder.

Our building is a vital community asset. The chapel is the home of the Reepham Pre-school, with morning and afternoon sessions held Monday to Thursday during term time. The Parish Council, the Women's Institute and the local Arts Group also hire the hall. The Pre-school alone uses the building two and half times more than we do as a congregation.

Indeed, there is so much activity that we wish to develop our worship area to provide more flexibility. At the moment, we have a sloping floor, which limits the way we worship and restricts alternative uses. So, it is our intention to level the floor, turn the sanctuary round and provide an additional toilet and a facility to make hot drinks. We are in the process of submitting plans to get the necessary permissions, but we are moving forward in faith and raising money for the project.

Our congregation is drawn from the villages of Reepham, Fiskerton and Cherry Willingham. We have worked with the Anglican Church for many years and hold more frequent united services with the Methodist Church in Cherry Willingham. It is good to build each oth-

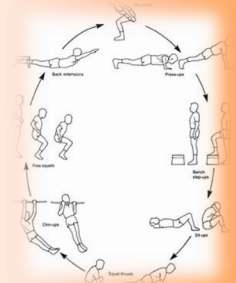

As I sit here preparing to write this, we are quickly approaching the 10-month mark since launching this incredible and unique ministry here on the St Giles estate and as part of the St Giles Methodist Church.

As I look back over the last ten months, I praise God and thank Him for opening doors and allowing Eden to grow.

Not only have new doors opened for Eden, but pre-existing ministries and church events have increased and flourished as a knock-on effect.

We've been blessed to be invited into several local schools (2 primary and 3 secondary) to lead lessons, assemblies and run after-school clubs on a weekly basis. We are excited by the further opportunities when the new school year begins.

We have been invited into HMP Lincoln on several occasions to run services and share testimony and are working closely with them still to launch a couple of choirs for the inmates and are honoured and blessed by this opportunity to share God's love through music with the inmates.

Our team has grown from 1 to 3, but we are still praying for more people to hear the call from God and decide to move sacrificially onto the estate and join the team.

This summer holidays we have supported other charities in running 2 weeks of sports-based summer holiday camps for 11 to 18-year olds, seeing over 50 young people.

We also help organise and run a week-long joint churches summer holiday club for primary school age children using Scripture Unions Guardians of Ancora material. We saw 25 children everyday who heard of Jesus' love and spent a day looking at different expressions of prayer.

As we look and pray for the next few months, listening to God to guide us, we'll be launching a new weekly youth club for 11 to 18-year olds.

Shoebboxes will need to be collected at the end of October so please remember to get your items ready.

Environmental Concerns – Do you look round your house and wonder where changes could help protect our environment. One room which often has lots of plastic bottles and tubs is the bathroom. Plastic toothbrushes from decades ago have been dug up and they have not degraded and so one small item millions of times over polluting our earth. Bamboo toothbrushes with degradable bristles are widely available now. Holland & Barratt sell bio-degradable heads for electric toothbrushes. Have you looked at the toothpaste you use? Is it's tube recyclable and are the ingredients natural? Look further afield and find a natural product without chemicals – it will clean your teeth just as well and help our environment. Do you turn off the tap while cleaning your teeth? We can waste six litres or more of water by leaving the tap running. Fill a small cup with water and use this to rinse your brush and mouth. The toilet too uses lots of water – 15-20 litres – reduce your consumption by placing a brick (carefully) in the cistern or fill a plastic bottle with water, cap it and place in the cistern; as well as helping our environment your water bills will be reduced. Lastly save trees. On average families use 110 rolls of toilet paper over a year and less than 10% are made with recycled paper which means virgin forests in Scandinavia are used. With regard to
